

Primary Studio | Ages 3-6 yrs old

8:30–9:20 AM – Arrival & Free Time (Outdoors)

Learners arrive and begin the day outside. After storing their belongings and hanging up nap mats, they engage in gross motor play: running, climbing, sliding, sand exploration, and imaginative play in the outdoor kitchen.

9:20-9:30 AM - Morning Circle & Calendar Time

The group gathers to greet the day, discuss the season, weather, and calendar, and receive a whole-group lesson before beginning independent work.

9:30-11:00 AM - Morning Work Cycle & Snack

Learners engage in uninterrupted work time across the core Montessori areas: Practical Life, Language, Math, Sensorial, and Geography. Guides present one-on-one and small-group lessons tailored to each learner's readiness. A self-serve snack is available during this time.

11:00-11:20 AM - Music & Movement

An energetic break filled with songs, instruments, and movement activities that support rhythm, listening, and coordination.

11:20-11:30 AM - Story Time

A short read-aloud helps learners settle and transition into lunchtime.

11:30-11:40 AM - Lunch Prep

Learners are dismissed to wash their hands and prepare their own place settings, pour water, and wait until everyone is ready before beginning lunch, fostering independence and social grace.

11:40 AM-12:00 PM - Lunch

12:00-12:45 PM - Free Time (Outdoors)

Gross motor play continues with climbing, jumping, riding bikes and scooters, and connecting with peers.

12:45-1:00 PM - Story Time & Nap Prep

Learners wind down with a quiet story before preparing for rest.

1:00-2:35 PM - Rest & Afternoon Work Cycle

Learners who need rest are given a peaceful environment to nap. Those who remain awake engage in a shorter, guide-led work cycle with materials focused on pre-reading, phonemic awareness, number sense, and early writing. For learners who are ready, this includes progressing through Kindergarten-level Montessori curriculum to support a confident transition into elementary.

2:45 PM - Dismissal

Learners practice independence by gathering their belongings and preparing for pickup with minimal assistance.
